- November 1st begins CCI new grant year. 700 is the caseload requirement set by ODH
- Need two more service providers for CCI program; this

<p>DREAM Program Presentation – Brandy Booth, Knox County JFS, Ohio Means Jobs</p>	<p>DREAM Program Presentation...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Launched July 1, 2016 -Serves 14-24, willing to assess individuals outside of this age range -Recently renamed “DREAM” -Program is designed to encourage kids to stay in school giving them the support needed to do so. -Targets low income families -Goal is to intersect with someone who is behind in school. Help them recover credits by attending school thru program certified teacher -Many successes, some failures. Individuals must put in time and do the work -Comprehensive continuity in case management. One case worker assigned at the beginning of the program they continue with that case worker throughout the program. -Participation in the program provides for services for the entire family -Referral forms available -Work with municipal and felony court -Requirement – participant must agree to participate at least 20 hours per week. -Susan offered Triple P
