<b>Welcome, Introductions</b>	<p><b>Lori Jones-Perkins:</b> New Directions is hosting a SafeZone training (presented by BRAVO) on how to work more respectfully with the LGBTQ population on September 25th. Flyer will be sent out to committee.</p> <p><b>Judy Gregg:</b> her class will be researching each CHIP strategy to find evidence based strategies. They'll present their work in late October.</p> <p><b>Kay Spergel:</b> the 8<sup>th</sup> annual "Art of Recovery" will open Friday, Sept. 7<sup>th</sup> during First Friday. This is an exhibit of the work of men and women who identify themselves being in recovery. They tell their stories through their artwork. The "Art of Recovery" is displayed within MVNU's building on Main Street.</p> <p><b>Julie Miller:</b> KCHD is hosting an accreditation celebration and community members/partners are invited. An invitation will be sent out to the committee.</p> <p><b>Joy Harris:</b> Interchurch Social Services' 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration is on October 14th. They'll begin with a worship service at 4pm and then a dinner celebration at St. Vincent School. Interchurch will also be accepting Christmas applications then, too.</p> <p><b>Tami Ruhl:</b> breaking ground at Memorial Park for the inclusive playground now. Concrete pad will take 4-6 weeks to complete. Equipment will be installed 4-6 weeks after. Ribbon cutting ceremony hopefully in November.</p>	<b>None</b>

	<p>glossary of the acronyms commonly used across Knox County. Members listed their acronyms.</p> <p><b>Susan McDonald:</b> The Resilience team continues to offer <i>Resilience</i> showings. Thursday, Sept. 6<sup>th</sup>- two showings: 9am &amp; 1pm at Memorial Theatre- open to the public. 560 people have viewed the film since they started their showings.</p> <p><b>Peg Tazewell:</b> Resilience team, in partnership with Ariel Foundation and The Village Network, will begin hosting trainings focused on trauma: “The 6 R’s” The first training is mandatory in order to attend the other 5 trainings. “Relationships &amp; Rewards” (the 1<sup>st</sup> training) will be offered three times throughout late September / October. There are a few evening trainings. Will send the flyer out to KHPP. CEUS are being applied for.</p> <p><b>Julie Miller:</b> Asked if the ARTIC (Attitudes Related to Trauma Informed Care) Survey results were being taken into consideration when planning trauma-informed care initiatives. Peg and Kay confirmed that the results have been analyzed and are pretty consistent from agency to agency. Follow-up / action steps are being determined.</p> <p><b>Kay Spergel:</b> MHR created a tri-fold brochure for agencies to use that explains trauma, ACES &amp; actionable steps for community members. MHR has professionally printed 500 copies &amp; can print more if agencies would like.</p>	
<p><b>ODH CCI Grant Information/Training</b> – <i>Mike Whitaker, Knox County Health Department</i></p>	<p>CCI- Community Cessation Initiative – is an ODH grant with a consortium with Licking and Perry county health departments. Cessation services include all forms of tobacco/nicotine use (vaping, JUUL, cigarettes, chewing, etc.). CCI will not allow enrollment of individuals under 18.</p> <p>This year, CCI aims in reaching those in disparate populations, such as pregnant mothers, low socioeconomic and the LGBTQIA+ community. The second year of the grant starts in November 2018 with an added mental health population. Also for year two, ODH has set forth the goal of enrolling 721 adult tobacco users for Knox County.</p> <p>Mike is looking for both “referral” and “service” providers. Referral providers would refer their clients they serve who note they’d like to quit using tobacco to Mike and he can set them up with the appropriate cessation services. Service providers would offer tobacco cessation services at their agency. A service provider can be a certified tobacco treatment specialist (CTTS), but not required.</p> <p>Mike distributed a referral survey for members who might be interested in being a referral provider.</p>	

<p><b>Kenyon College Nutrition/Eating Disorders –</b> <i>Chris Smith, Kenyon College</i></p>	<p>Chris noted that hopefully they will determine a time to offer a tobacco cessation class on campus this year. He also thanked Kay Spergel for hosting Mental Health First Aid training.</p> <p>Kenyon has received a high number of calls regarding eating disorders. In the past, Kenyon typically refers individuals to the Center for Balanced Living in Columbus for appropriate help.</p> <p>Julie suggested Chris call the Center for Balanced Living to ask if they would come to Kenyon and provide services. She also noted that federal grant funds might be available to help offset their travel cost.</p> <p>Additionally, Chris noted that Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> - “Healthy Mind” survey. All students will receive this survey to gather data on the health needs of Kenyon College. Survey will be open for 4 weeks for students / staff to complete.</p>	
<p><b>Discussion of update draft organizational chart and functional charts –</b> Carmen Barbuto, Knox County Health</p>	<p>Carmen sent out <i>draft</i> forms of an organizational &amp; functional chart for the committee to review prior to today’s meeting.</p> <p><b>Peg:</b> the Resilience team can be most supportive by serving as the committee for Trauma-Informed Care: a cross-cutting factor.</p> <p><b>Carmen:</b> Smoking Cessation could be spear-headed by CCI. Mike asked that Smoking Cessation be changed to Tobacco &amp; Nicotine-based Cessation.</p> <p><b>Peg:</b> asked that the cross cutting strategies (trauma-informed care &amp; tobacco/nicotine cessation) somehow be incorporated on the functional charts.</p> <p><b>Carmen:</b> Local Food Council- Tami had a conversation with this group as their work pertains to one of the CHIP strategies: Community Gardens</p> <p>Nancy asked if there was an update regarding the Public Health Partnership (PHP) joining with KHPP. Julie noted that PHP did not meet in August so a formal decision has not been made.</p> <p>There was a discussion regarding the need to incorporate the homelessness population in these charts.</p>	<p><b>Carmen will make edits as suggested and re-send the document</b></p>
